Oxfordshire Local
Authorities were the first in the UK to sign the Armed
Forces Covenant. These authorities and many organisations in Oxfordshire including SSAFA and The Royal British Legion, are committed to offering the best possible support to the Armed Forces Family – serving personnel, veterans and their families – across Oxfordshire.

The Armed Forces Covenant sets out the relationship between the Nation, the Government and the Armed Forces. It recognises that the whole nation has a moral obligation to members of the Armed Forces Family, and it establishes how they should be treated.

Organisations signing up to the Covenant provide a voluntary pledge of mutual support between their organisation and the Armed Forces Family.

What education support could you EDUCATION receive?

Contact the County Council, your chosen College or University for advice on:

- Access to chosen school catchment area for children of serving personnel.
- Recognition of current competencies or prior learning for service related training.
- Enhanced learning credits scheme.
- Apprenticeship schemes.

Serving Personnel – Who do you contact to discuss welfare issues?

- Service personnel should contact their unit welfare officer.
- During transition Veterans UK deliver a veterans welfare service.
